The **5Terre Environmental Resource Archaeology (5T.ERA)** meeting on

historical and environmental characterization of rural landscapes and local products: European experiences applied to conservation and valorisation

is part of a multidisciplinary project started in 2017 thanks to the collaboration between public and private institutions in order to study and enhance the rural landscape of the Cinque Terre area. The first phase of this project involved different investigations promoted by an interdisciplinary team composed by historians, archaeologists, archaeobotanists and ecologists for the historical characterization of the local landscape and its local productions¹.

The Meeting will be held on May 23-26th 2019 in Genoa and in the Cinque Terre National Park (SP).

As is known, the Laboratory LASA has developed in the last decades a multidisciplinary historical, archaeological and environmental approach to the problems of characterization and conservation of environmental and cultural heritage inspired by the development of historical ecology. Particular attention has been devoted to the study of the historical relationship between individual rural landscapes and local productions (*produits de terroir*).

The aim of the conference is to identify and compare historical and environmental characterization models that have been applied in the planning and management of rural heritage or protected areas (i.e. Natural Parks, SCI, etc.).

Experts will be invited to present case studies located in Europe or bring a general contribution. These experiences will be shared and compared during the first two days of the meeting (May 23-24th). The comparison's results will produce a series of synthetic recommendations included in an "Application Guidelines for the Historical and Environmental characterization of rural landscapes and local products". This document proposed by the researchers/experts will be further discussed in the following days (May 25th-26th) during a workshop planned with local and national institutions delegates, stakeholders and local producers. The latter will be met on the last day (May 26th) during the field trip devoted to some small farms located in the Cinque Terre National Park.

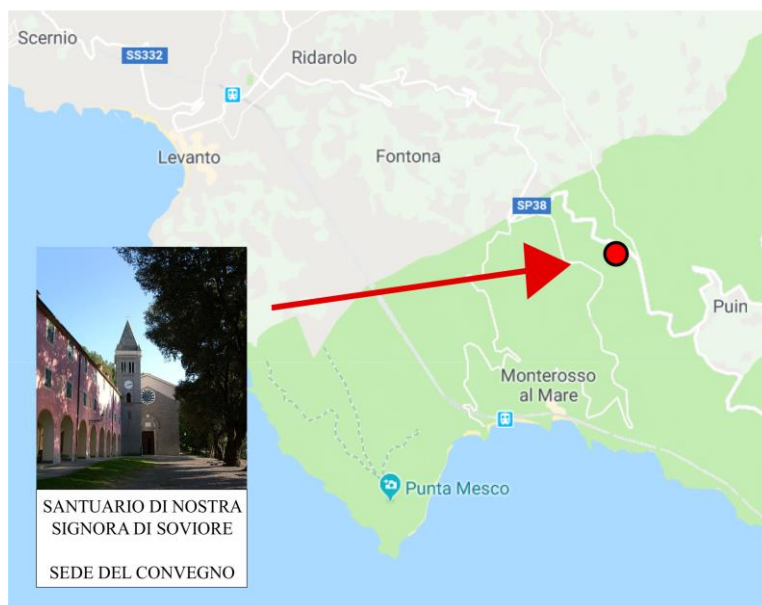
